The COMPANY and the INSTITUTION are collectively referred to as the "Parties" and individually referred to as a "Party".

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the proposals submitted by the COMPANY, discussions, promises, undertaking herein contained and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Program Summary

i. - Appoint SPOC to
 - o Facilitate/coordinate all the training activities with the COMPANY
 - Ensure candidates comply with the COMPANY instructions
- Provide infrastructure and other necessities in the college premises for conducting classroom trainings
- e. Ensure 80% attendance for the programin both ILT / VILT sessions
- f. Coordinate disciplined participation of the students
- g. Shall jointly monitor and reviewprogram milestonesalong with the COMPANY
- h. Shall facilitate participation of the candidates for activities of the program
- i. Provide access to the representatives from the COMPANY who are visiting the INSTITUTION
- j. Provide boarding and lodging for the trainers at the cost of the INSTITUTION for conducting the classroom trainings
- k. Branding, Communication, Publicity and Trademark of the program
 - INSTITUTION agrees that the logos which will be shared by NASSCOM Foundation only will be implemented wherever required under this agreement.
 - 2. COMPANY will work with INSTITUTION to ensure that all communication is agreed upon ahead of time as per agreed guidelines.
 - INSTITUTION agrees that any content, LMS, app, source code developed under this
 Agreement will be owned by the COMPANY. Appropriate branding will be done with
 consent and prior approval.



4. INSTITUTIONShall not without the prior written consent of the COMPANY:

Take any photograph or video of the beneficiaries etc. for use in any merchandising publicity or advertising;

Publish alone or in conjunction with any person any article, photograph, testimonials of the beneficiaries or other illustration either in social media or print or any other mode;

Impart to any publication, journal or newspaper or any radio or television iii. programme or any online platform any information in relation to this Agreement.

Release any press statements or other publicity, including videos, testimonials, case studies of the beneficiaries in relation to the Agreement or the transactions contemplated by this Agreement.

COMPANY shall

- Provide training calendar in agreement with the INSTITUTION
- m. Provide trainings to the candidates in the modes of ILT/Platform/vILT modes in the ratio of 40% / 40% / 20% - Refer to annexure-I
- n. Deploy trainers in the ratio of 1:100 candidates, and as acceptable to the INSTITUTION
- Provide training links and access to the training collateral, and coding platform as necessary
- p. Provide 60% placements to the eligible and certified candidates
- q. Organizing job melas / recruitment drives as appropriate
- r. Create, maintain, and manage a comprehensive placement planner and tracker.
- Support candidates to create student profiles, resumes, CVs, and Covering letters.

2. Term:

This agreement shall be effective from the commencement date mentioned above and will be effective for a period by which time the complete payment is made by the institution, unless terminated earlier as per Clause 4 of this agreement.

3. Payment Terms:

4. Termination:

- a. This agreement shall terminate on the completion of term except for the clauses specifically mentioned below at 4b,4c and 4d.
- b. COMPANY&INSTITUTION may terminate this Agreement in the event of material breach of one's scope of work and such breach is not cured within thirty (30) days of written notice to the other of such breach.
- c. The COMPANY may terminate this Agreement for its sole convenience by giving thirty (30) days advance notice in writing/e-mail to the INSTITUTION. In such event INSTITUTION shall cease work immediately after receiving notice from the COMPANY unless otherwise advised by the COMPANY.

5. Dispute Resolution:

a. This agreement shall be governed according to the Indian laws and each Party shall submit to the jurisdiction of the Courts at Hyderabad, Telangana, India.



- b. Any and all differences and disputes whatsoever arising between the Parties concerning the interpretation or implementation of this Agreement or in relation to the subject matter contained in this Agreement shall, in the first instance, be resolved mutually between the Parties and in the event of non-resolution, the matter shall be referred to arbitration.
- c. Arbitration proceedings shall be held in Hyderabad in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and procedures established for the purposes of regulating and determining matters relating to or arising from arbitration. Both the Parties shall mutually appoint one arbitrator failing which the dispute shall be decided by an arbitration panel consisting of 3 arbitrators. Each Party shall appoint one arbitrator and both the arbitrators so appointed shall appoint a third arbitrator, who shall preside over the arbitration proceedings. Any decision, determination or award of the Arbitrator/s shall be binding on the Parties. Unless otherwise decided by the arbitrator/s, the cost of arbitration shall be shared by the Parties in equal proportion.

6. Indemnity:

- 6.1The COMPANY shall, fully indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the INSTITUTION and its officers, Directors, employees, representatives, agents, respective directors, and assigns from and against any liability or any other loss, damage, whether incidental or consequential, that may occur, arising from or relating to:
 - a. A breach, by the COMPANY of any of the terms, conditions, covenants, representations, undertakings, obligations, deficiencies, warranties, and compliance of appliable laws under this Agreement.
 - b. The acts, significant errors, misrepresentations, willful misconduct or negligence of the COMPANY, its employees, in performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
 - c. Termination of the agreement without giving sufficient notice as defined in clause 6 and particularly when the batches for training are scheduled.

Similarly, the INSTITUTION shall indemnify the COMPANY and its officers, Directors, employees, representatives, agents, respective directors, and assigns from and against any liability or any other loss, damage, whether incidental or consequential, that may occur, arising from or relating to:

- a. The acts, significant errors, misrepresentations, willful misconduct or negligence of the INSTITUTION, its employees, in performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- b. A breach, by the INSTITUTION of any of the terms, conditions, covenants, representations, undertakings, obligations, deficiencies, warranties, and compliance of appliable laws under this Agreement.

7. Confidentiality and use restriction:

a. No information either disclosed by the INSTITUTION or acquired through any other means or known incidentally by the COMPANY, either marked confidential or not, shall not be shared or



used by the COMPANY or any other third party through the COMPANY, without prior written approval from the authorized signatory of the INSTITUTION.

b. Information means: financial data, data (Includes all sources and object code if any), knowhow, trade secrets, designs, plans, reports, customer and supplier lists, pricing information, marketing techniques, material related to business activities, manufacturing, design, development, or products acquired through the expenditure of time, effort and money, of a technical and business nature - business plans, content, market information, drawings, sketches, samples, devices, flow charts, compiled computer programs, algorithms, software source codes, firmware source codes, hardware, methods, processes, procedures, specifications, bills of materials, parts lists, descriptions or customer lists, description and data of participants, results of research, equipment, software, designs, samples, technology, technical, documentation, product or service specifications or strategies, marketing plans, pricing information, financial information, information related to existing, previous and potential suppliers, customers, contracts and products, inventions, unreleased software applications, methodologies and other know-how, drawings, photographs models, mock-ups, and design and performance specifications, production volumes, and production schedules which are owned, controlled or possessed by Company respectively whether provided in tangible form, by electronic media, by visual display or orally,

8. Compliance with Applicable Laws:

Both parties ensure that all work performed within the scope of their work under this Agreement shall comply with all applicable Indian laws and regulations.

COMPANYshall be responsible to provide all required documentation and perform all necessary compliances under the GST Act to make Company eligible to claim the input tax credit of GST. In case Company is unable to claim the input tax credit due to but not limited to Service Provider failure to declare the correct information on the invoice and upload the same under GST portal viz. the amount, the place of supply, rate of tax etc., then the amount pertaining to the GST paid by COMPANY shall be refunded by Service Provider and the amount shall be recovered from Service Provider, as the case may be.

9. Severability:

- or of principal and agent as between the INSTITUTION and the COMPANY d. No failure or delay by any Party in exercising any right, power or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof nor shall any single or partial exercise of any other right, power, or privilege. The rights and remedies herein provided shall be cumulative and not exclusive of any rights or remedies provided by law.



Report On Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, MMCC

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a significant initiative of the Government of India aimed at driving rural development through the collaboration of higher educational institutions and rural communities. MMCC, with its vision of promoting quality education and sustainable development, has taken part in this flagship program by adopting five villages in Pune district: Ambi, Agalambe, Zalanwadi, Matalwadi, and Gorhe.

Furthermore, to encourage education and mentorship opportunities in these villages, four-day value education programs were held at the schools. Through these initiatives, students benefited from enhanced educational facilities and were exposed to issues prevalent in rural areas. The student volunteers actively participated in all activities, witnessing positive role models and gaining insights into moral values, gender equality, respect, and the importance of education.

The faculty members of MMCC have also played a crucial role in the success of the program, showing enthusiastic engagement and commitment to the cause.



(57) Abstract:

The system comprises a plurality of sensors (102) for measuring a plurality of parameters such as the humidity, the soil moisture and temperature in the polyhouse; a plurality of signal conditioning device (104) connected to the plurality of sensors for optimizing captured analog signals obtained from each of the plurality of sensors (102); an analog multiplexer (106) connected to each of the plurality of signal conditioning device (104) for data acquisition; a controller (110) connected to the converter (108) for generating a plurality of instructions to control the analog multiplexer (106), wherein the humidity data is collected based on a first instruction, the soil moisture data is collected based on a second instruction and the temperature data is collected based on a third instruction; and a display and a control module (112) connected to the controller (110) for displaying the plurality of parameters sensed by the plurality of sensors (102)
