## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

## MARATHWADA MITRA MANDAL'S COLLEGE OF COMMERCE (MMCC)

(jointly referred as parties)

- > Considering the traditional links of friendship between the Parties regions
- > Recognizing the mutual interest and benefits of strengthening cooperation
- > Taking into consideration the objectives of both parties to promote and support their efforts towards the development of multilateral regional cooperation.

Realizing the strengths of **WTC Pune** and **MMCC** and conscious of the benefits to be derived by both organizations through this mutual understanding, both parties willingly agree to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to cooperate with each other in facilitating mutual investment, trade and economic cooperation for education and training of young minds.

1. WTC Pune as an institution for business and is an opportunity to grow and foster international trade and services. The WTCA services availed are reciprocal: reflecting on those who doing business from here, and those bringing business here. WTC members can access these services at all operating WTCs around the world at 326 plus locations in 91 plus countries and belong to an elite group consisting of 750,000 odd international companies.





- 2. MARATHWADA MITRA MANDAL'S COLLEGE OF COMMERCE (MMCC) located at 202/ A, Deccan Gymkhana, Pune 04 is one of the leading college in commerce. The colleges mission "Welfare to the masses" truly been followed by all stakeholders since last 30 years. - 3. Areas of possible mutual, non-financial co-operation between MoU parties:
  - To identify possible areas of education, trade promotion and investment that will help generate trade flows between the respective regions / support activities of the parties in line with their stated objectives.
  - To encourage collaboration in programs that may, from time to time, be arranged between the Parties that support the development of standards and conformance systems that facilitate training, trade and commerce of mutual regions and interests

  - To organize joint events which focus on promotion of EDUCATION, TRADE, SERVICES AND INVESTMENT in the region including, but not limited to, Trade Exhibitions, Buyer-Seller meets, Business Development meets, One-To-One meetings, Symposiums, Seminars, Workshops, Training Programs, Skill Certifications, Industrial Missions, Marketing Studies, Awards and Recognition Programs and knowledge Technology Sharing Initiatives, etc. as may be mutually beneficial
  - To exchange relevant information about International trade fairs and exhibitions to be held in mutual regions and other locations so as to grant each other the widest cooperation and technical support within their possibilities to encourage the participation of the respective enterprises, entities and members in the events of their interest, with preferential treatment / charges, as may be feasible and jointly decided.
  - To keep constant and close contacts and provide each other and their constituent members with information with regard to trade and economic cooperation, etc.





- To facilitate exchange of publications, information and documentation, etc. on international programs organized by them, for exchange of professional expertise and other issues of reciprocal interest including bi-lateral trade, foreign trade and investment / regulatory policies of their respective regions and also endeavour to keep mutual literature in their respective libraries for use of trade and commerce
- 4. Annual plan of action may be drawn up in consultation with each other and mutual activities undertaken accordingly. Annual review of plan v/s. achievement to be undertaken to measure effectivity of MoU. Special Agreements shall be mutually worked out between the Parties, specifying the responsibilities of the Parties. These agreements will be done on a case-to-case basis depending on the kind of event organised and will specify in details the mutual scope of each party, event type and format, category of participants, financial and logistics aspects, etc.
- 5. Both parties shall endeavour to give publicity of this MoU partnership and agree to limit use of respective logos for purpose of joint initiatives only, with mutual consent. WTC logo is proprietary trademark and IPR protected so use carefully.
- 6. The parties shall mutually endeavor to give publicity among its members about each other's activities as also events conducted jointly through newsletters, magazines, emails and other promotional materials including third party initiatives like WTCA, social and print media
- 7. Both parties shall provide each other with feasible consultancy services within their respective business scope to promote mutual parties interest.
- 8. Both parties will assist each other in obtaining reliable and competitive offers of services and accommodation facilities to support mutual activities joint programs.
- 9. Both the organizations are free to independently tie-up / sign MoUs / conduct any events / programmes on their own or with other mutual partners, including those covered under this MoU.
- 10. The MoU shall come into force upon signing of both the organizations and shall remain valid for 3 years from the date of signing of the MoU and shall be automatically extended unless a notice in writing has been given by either Party requesting the termination of this agreement, 1 month before the date of its expiry. During the term, this MOU can be cancelled or terminated by either party without assigning any reason by giving 1 month written notice.





- 11. This Memorandum of Understanding is entered between parties with sole intention to achieve above said purposes and objects without creating any partnership or right, title or interest of each other in their existing activities.
- 12. Any changes / amendments announced from time to time shall apply and be binding upon the parties during the tenure of the MoU by written consent.
- 13. The parties on mutual consent may renew the MoU from time-to-time and enhance the scope of the MoU, if required.



# REPORT ON ONE DAY WORKSHOP ON INSIGHTS INTO CORPORATE CULTURE BY WNS

Under the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with WNS, a one day workshop was organised for Third Year students on Insghts into corporate culture.
