5. MMCC is located in the heart of the city and is home to one of the most student-driven environment in Pune, the institute thrives on the efforts of its students who continue to prove their mettle in curricular, co-curricular & extracurricular and sports events thereby strengthening the brand of the institute. MMCC through its meritorious students continues to be one of the leaders in Commerce education.

Governance, management & Administration of the institution

Governance:

- 1. The top management of the organization is financially sound, and an able decision-making body.
- 2. The parent body promotes the organization in every way. The Governance structure supports academic and financial needs of the institution robustly.

Management:

- 3. The Principal of the institution is qualified and on a regular full-time post. He is a member of NEP Task Force, Maharashtra State. The organization has a healthy and conducive working environment owing to the effective management and coordination.
- 4. The college has a profound Vision, Mission, and Goals which are reflected in all its academic, managerial, and administrative activities.
- 5. A proper CDC as per Maharashtra University Act (2016) requirements. Both CDC and IQAC have undertaken several important quality initiatives during the academic year 2022-23.
- 6. The AQARs have been submitted regularly as per statutory body schedule. The IQAC is an active institutionalized body in the organization.
- 7. The website is updated and well-maintained with relevant statutory disclosures and institutional updates.
- 8. The allocation of responsibilities and work is documented and implemented properly.
- 9. The financial audits are conducted on a regular basis every year. There are no discrepancies.
- 10. The college has a well constituted student Council as per guidelines of the affiliating University.
- 11. The college has a functional student grievance redressal cell. Its meetings are conducted regularly however; no grievances have been reported.
- 12. The committees are in place and their reports suggest their sound working.

- 13. The college conducts academic audits regularly. During the pandemic the college has also conducted internal academic audits.
- 14. The college has an active internal complaints committee however, no grievances have been reported.
- 15. The college has a mandatory functional anti-ragging committee. The anti-ragging rules and regulations have been displayed at visible important places on the campus and on the website in accordance with guidelines of Prohibition and Eradication of Ragging Act, 2016.
- 16. The college has submitted relevant information for an All-India Survey of Higher Education (AISHE), NIRF and to various other statutory bodies regularly.
- 17. The college has its Policies, processes, and SOPs in place. The policies are updated periodically as per prevailing situations and norms.

Administration:

- 18. The administrative processes are in place, well documented, and functional.
- 19. The documents are retrievable and working is technologically well supported.
- 20. The administrative staff is qualified and experienced.
- 21. The administration hours are sufficient for the stakeholders. The administration is stakeholder friendly and prompt in its services. The systems are in place.
- 22. Administrative work is supported by a technologically sound ecosystem.
- 23. A healthy work culture prevails in the administrative section.

Academics:

- 24. The institution caters to UG courses in Commerce & Management and Science & Technology and PG courses in Commerce and Journalism and Mass Communication. The institution conducts the courses in three shifts.
- 25. The enrolment ratio is 100 % along with 10% additional seats as sanctioned by affiliating university.
- 26. The admission process is conducted at the college level using Vriddhi software.
- 27. The teacher-to-student ratio is 1:47.
- 28. The student to computer ratio is 1: 14
- 29. All classrooms are ICT enabled with two smart classrooms; state of the art auditoriums, computer labs, and e-learning resource centers. Additional facilities include the gymnasium, canteen and student interaction areas. The institution has taken special initiatives to create a disability friendly campus especially the visually impaired.

- 30. The POs COs for all courses are available on the website and communicated to all the stakeholders. The students and parents are informed about them effectively during orientation programmes. The PO CO attainment is calculated using statistical mechanisms. The slow and advanced learners are thus identified and treated accordingly.
- 31. The student results for all programmes are around 90 percent.
- 32. The college caters well to student diversity including the category, non-category, and other state students.
- 33. Academic calendar is prepared each year and executed effectively.
- 34. The course files are properly designed comprising of an academic calendar, teaching plan, timetable, attendance records, concurrent assessment schedule and scheme.
- 35. The timetable is well executed and the student attendance mechanisms are well -defined and implemented.
- 36. Students have the freedom to choose value added and add on courses from the choice-based credit system as per affiliating University norms. The college offers 10 value added courses from the choice basket offered by the affiliating university.
- 37. Additional 5 certificate courses are conducted the college through MOUs with various external academic and industrial partners such as ICT Academy, NASSCOM, ATOS Syntel, Bajaj Finserv.
- 38. Teaching staff belong to different states and bring in demographic diversity; is well qualified and efficient and is professionally progressive.
- 39. The college has conducted lectures in offline mode and guest lectures, orientations and value-added courses in online mode.
- a. Variety of teaching pedagogies and technology-based teaching aids are used in order to facilitate synchronous and asynchronous learning during the online teaching mode.
- b. Traditional classroom teaching has been conducted during the offline teaching mode with both traditional and modern methods.
- 40. Students are given internships, projects, tutorials, field visits and industrial tours to facilitate the process of experiential learning.
- 41. The college has a well-structured assessment and evaluation systems in place.

- a. Continuous internal assessments are planned as per academic calendar, is fair and communicated to all students to all the students in advance. Transparency is ensured with the involvement of student representatives in the planning and execution of multiple internal assessments for the students.
- b. External evaluation is as per affiliating university guidelines. First and second years of all UG courses have been subjected to home assessment in a fair and systematic manner and all protocols have been adhered to.
- c. The students have earned extra credits for participation in all co-curricular, extracurricular, extension and research activities.
- d. Results are calculated on the basis of CGPA as per 2019 pattern CBCS norms of affiliating University.
- e. The college has been the CAP center for answer booklet assessment for MAJMC Masters in Journalism and mass communication for this year.

Co-curricular and Student Progression

- 42. The college has a dynamic and active Students development cell SDC that conducts various co-curricular and extracurricular activities:
- a. Co-curricular activities: The college has organized various guest lectures, seminars and workshops and career guidance sessions for students on different topics and arenas.
- b. Cultural Activities: The college has achieved cultural sensitization of students through unique cultural programmes such as Folk fusion.
- c. Extension and outreach activities: College has a dynamic and active NSS unit with a student strength of 100. The NSS unit has performed commendable activities as community outreach programmes benefiting the students and community at large. The college undertook rural development programe in 5 villages under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.
- d. Art circle: The college has a vibrant art circle and has made participated in various events such as Purushottam Karandak and Suvarna Kalash Ekankika Spardha

- e. Sports: The college has good contribution in the field of sports. The college has bagged a total of 28 medals in various sports at International, National, state and University levels. These sports include swimming, boxing, archery, lawn tennis, wrestling, shooting, Judo, Chess, Badminton and Yoga.
- f. Earn and Learn Scheme: The college executes the Earn and Learn Scheme offered by the affiliating University where students are paid honorarium on hourly basis. This year the scheme has benefited 21 students in need.
- g. Alumni contribution: The college has a registered Alumni Association. The college organized an in -person alumni meet. The alumni also take guest lectures on various topics for existing students.
- h. Placements: The placement cell is active and has a good placement record. The college has 110 recruiters on board. The college has placed 52 students this year with the highest package being 4 lakhs per annum. 157 students shortlisted during mega campus placement drive are in process. The training activities go on for the entire year and a variety of experiences are given by the organization to the students.

Students Services

43. Campus:

- a. All classrooms are ICT enabled along with two smart classrooms; state of the art auditoriums, computer labs, and e-learning resource centers.
- b. Additional facilities include the gymnasium, canteen, parking area, library, and student interaction areas. The campus is wi-fi enabled with a bandwidth of 50 MBPS.
- c. The entire campus is under CCTV surveillance with round the clock security services. The college has a disable friendly infrastructure with wheel chair ramp and elevator. Tactile path, braille signboards and maps are placed in order to facilitate visually impaired students.

44. Library:

- a. The library is well equipped and regularly new books are introduced
- b. Both physical and virtual learning resources are available for the students.

- c. The library is fully automated with all books having barcode system and automated check -in and check-out systems. The attendance in the library is also recorded digitally.
- 45. Labs and E-learning resource centers:
- a. College has 5 labs with 250 computers.
- b. NASSCOM has given CSR funding for upgradation of computer lab with 25 new computers having i7 processors. The total expenses incurred being around Rs.14 lakhs.
- 46. Canteen:
- a. The college has an in campus canteen offering subsidized food products.
- b. The canteen is clean and hygienically maintained.
- 47. Sports facilities:
- a. The college has a well-equipped gymnasium. The college has indoor games provisions such as chess, carrom and table tennis. For outdoor game facilities the college collaborates with other sister institutes.

Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges (SWOC)

Notable areas of mention

1. Strengths of the organization:

- a. College is centrally located with good accessibility to all the stakeholders.
- b. Strong, supportive dynamic and democratic management with a strong belief in its motto "Welfare of the Masses" benefiting students from various socio- economic backgrounds with special focus on the students from the Marathwada region.
- c. The college has a strong and dedicated legacy with notable alumni and existing students making contribution in the field of sports and cultural activities.
- d. The college has well connected alumni on good positions and a strong word of mouth.

2. Weaknesses of the organization

- a. The college should have a well-established system for monitoring student progression.
- b. The college needs to focus on alumni engagement.
- c. Research projects and research funding needs to improve. The college needs to submit more proposals to various agencies in this regard.

3. Opportunities in the near future:

- a. The college is in the process of designing curricula in parlance with other progressive institutes in the view of NEP 2020.
- b. The college can be a mentoring institute to other colleges preparing for the accreditation process.
- c. The college can be a mentoring institute to other colleges towards the successful implementation of NEP 2020.
- d. The college can initiate collaborations with other foreign universities with a view to facilitate student and faculty exchange.

4. Challenges:

- a. Redesigning the curriculum to be at par with other autonomous colleges and industry requirements as a constituent college of affiliating university.
- b. Focusing on developing new interactive teaching pedagogies in order to overcome students limited attention span owing to excessive use of devices.

5. Compliances:

- a. The college has received funding through SPPU and NAAC and has organized seminars and workshops for the preparedness of NEP 2020 for students and faculties. The ISRO nodal center is active and has conducted workshop on remote sensing in collaboration with other colleges from Marathwada region.
- b. The college has established the collaboration with Outlive to strike the mental and emotional balance amongst students and faculties.
- c. The college has established a foreign language cell and has added new languages with German, French and Spanish.
- d. The college has organized various certificate courses with industry participation resulting in skill enhancement of the students.
- e. The college has established an electoral literacy club in tune with the guidelines issued by ECI.

Recommendations:

- a. Mentoring institution for NAAC and NEP guidance to other institutions seeking mentoring.
- b. Faculty research and funding can be further enhanced.

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
